It's time for a slam! A Poetry Slam!

This week is all about 'Slam Poetry' – a form of performance poetry! But don't worry!

Anyone can do it. Trust me, in the past few years some of my favourite poetry ever has come from children in Year 5.

But what is Slam Poetry, I hear you cry?

In the words of Harry Baker, 2012 Slam poetry world champion:

"Slam poetry is a format come up in America 30 years ago as a way of tricking people in to going to poetry events by putting an exciting word like 'slam' on the end. Each performer gets 3 minutes to perform and then random audience members would hold up some score cards" which meant that the audience gave direct feedback to the poet.

(Basically, it's a fun poetry competition where performers recite their poems and at the end, the one with the highest score wins! The best bit? Often the poems don't sound like poems – often sounding more like rap or even a story or argument with themselves!)

Often the poets are given a topic and they have free reign to create their poem however they like. The idea though is that the poems are performed, not just written down.

Have a look at the two poems below. They are well worth a watch as performance poetry should be performed, not read! The words for both of these poems are found in the <u>Dig a little deeper into poetry</u> link, so you can see which features I really like and that you could steal for your own poems if you would like to look at these poems in more detail.
