English 3TS and 3B – Myths and Legends This week we will be starting an exciting new English topic – Myths and Legends. We will start with the adventure story - King Arthur and The Sword in the Stone. We would like you to read the story or ask an adult to read the story to you. What is an adventure? What are the key features of an adventure story? King Arthur was a legendary British leader and legends are stories that are handed down through generations - they are partly true. Now that you have read or listened to the story, we would like you to retell the story using the storyboard template. Remember, you will only need to write the main parts of the story in order. Please remember to write neatly and clearly using capital letters and full stops. There is space above your writing to draw a picture of that particular part of the story.
