

# Homophones & Near Homophones

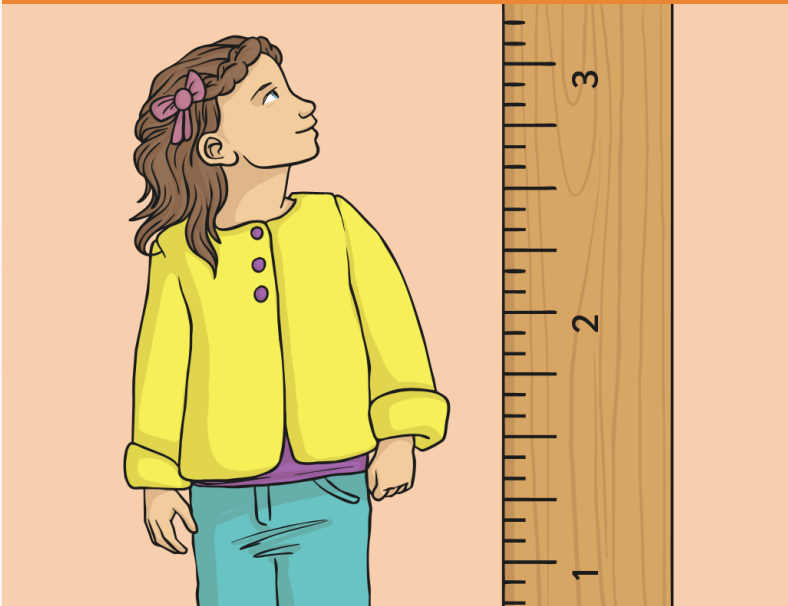


This week, we are going to look again at pairs of homophone words.
