- This week I have also included some resources to play a phonics based game, only if you wish to practise your spellings a little differently. Please don't feel as though you have to print out all the resources - you could re-create the same game:
 - create your own lily pads, putting the above ten words on each pad.
 - use a table at home to create your own pond and frog house.
 - use a small toy as your 'frog' to cross the pond.
 - the instructions ask you to read each word, but we also need to spell them before moving the frog on to the next lily pad. Enjoy!

'wh' Phonics Frog Game

You will need:

- 'wh' Phonics Frog Game Board
- Phonics Frog Game Pieces (Phonics Frog and Lily Pad 'wh' Cards)



Preparation:

Set up the board, sticking together the pages to form the pond.

Cut out the Phonics Frog and the Lily Pad 'wh' Cards.

Place the Lily Pad 'wh' Cards on their labelled space.

Place the Phonics Frog on the left-hand bank.

Instructions

1. The aim of the game is to get Phonics Frog back to his house on the other side of the pond.
2. The teacher or a partner will lay out a few lily pads across the pond.
3. If the children can read each lily pad correctly, Phonics Frog can make it home. Phonics Frog can move along the lily pads as the child reads the words correctly.
