<p><u>The Bishop's Palace</u> Did you know there was a Bishop's Palace in Nettleham? Well, there used to be until about 500 years ago, now we just have the site and the remains hidden under the grass. For the last few weeks of term we are going to be learning about this wonderful place.</p> <p>What do you know about this place? Had you heard of it before? Have you been there? Have you visited just to walk the dog, or to explore it as a historical site? What happened there? Why is it important? Talk about what you know and what you would <u>like</u> to know with an adult.</p> <p>The Bishops of Lincoln, and the Palace, was once very important, and it is said that the first Prince of Wales was created there! Here is some information about the Palace. What can you see? If you can, visit the site and walk round. It looks different when you are actually there!</p>	<p><u>Light and Shadows</u> Some of you may already have noticed with last week's final activity that shadows can change size as well as direction. This week we are going to explore this a little bit more.</p> <p>Unfortunately we can't use the Sun to help us investigate, as we need to be able to either move the light source or move the object much closer to the light source, which we can't do! So you need to find a dark place somewhere and use a torch.</p> <p>This sheet tells you more.</p> <p><u>Changing Shadows Sheet</u></p>	<p>In school we have been completing the <u>daily live workout by Joe Wicks</u> at 9 – 9:30am.
