You must have several parts to your answer. You can't just write $6 \times 4 = 24$! Example: $6 \times 4 = 100 - 76$ $6 \times 4 = (47 \times 2) - 70$ $6 \times 4 = 48 \div 2$	Multiplying 3 numbers <i>You will have done some examples in the arithmetic papers (there is also an explanation on the film clip).</i> Pick 3 numbers under 10. Multiply them together. Then multiply the same numbers together in a different order. Write the answers to both. Example $7 \times 3 \times 2 =$ <ul style="list-style-type: none"> $7 \times 3 = 21$ then $21 \times 2 = 42$ $3 \times 2 = 6$ then $6 \times 7 = 42$
