Comparing Vidyodaya School and Nettleham Junior School

- To explore school life at the Adivasi (tribal) school in Gudalur
- To compare and contrast school life in Gudalur with school life in the UK

Chembakolli village lies in the Nilgiri Hills in southern India. Adivasi people have lived there for centuries, respecting and nurturing the forest, land and soil.

However, there is no school for the Adivasi people in Chembakolli, only a small pre-school. The closest school is Vidyodaya School in Gudalur and is over 2km walk away with an additional jeep ride. Vidyodaya is a primary school that takes children up to 14 years old.
