Chemakolli is a village in the South of India, in a region called Tamil Nadu. Chembakoli's closest town is Gudalur and its closest city is Mysoreh.




Chembakolli

So far, we have mainly focused on the physical geography of India.

Physical geography refers to the natural features in the world. This includes details on the climate (the weather), rivers, mountains, volcanoes and earthquakes. All these features occur naturally on the earth.
