<p>3TS and 3B –Formal Letters</p> <p>Thank you all so much for your wonderful thank you letters. It's been really lovely to read how thoughtful and appreciative you are of the people around you! This week in English we will finish our topic by looking at formal letters.</p> <p>We would like you to write a letter of complaint. Imagine you have bought something and there is something wrong with it! You need to write to the person or company you bought it from to tell them what is wrong and get your money back. You can be as creative and imaginative as you like!</p> <p>Look at the power point below.
