Tips for Writing Factual Reports

• Write in the present tense:

Wolves have between 4 and 6 cubs.



Not Wolves had between 4 and 6 cubs. (otherwise it sounds like your animal is extinct)

- Make each area of your plan into a paragraph the introduction and ending can be short.
- If your paragraph is about food and hunting, make sure facts about other things don't creep in.
- Stick to facts e.g. The cubs feed on their mother's milk
 Not The cubs are so cute and cuddly.
- Conjunctions like if, when, although, because, after, before, while and unless will help you write longer, more detailed sentences.
- If you want to talk about your animal, but have used the word panda lots of times then try to use alternatives: these animals, this bear, these giant mammals etc.
- Pick any wild animal that you are interested in, but check that there is plenty of information available. For inspiration look at: https://www.natgeokids.com/uk/category/discover/animals
