# Convert Nouns or Adjectives into Verbs Using the Suffix -ise


Press f5 to go full screen This week, we are again looking at how nouns and adjectives can be changed into verbs using suffixes with spelling words such as....



-ise suffix words are usually just created by simply adding the -ise suffix to a noun or adjective root word, e.g. **terror** (noun)  $\rightarrow$  **terrorise** (verb).

However, sometimes we need to remove the 'e' from the end of noun or adjective root word before adding -ise, e.g. **fertile** (adjective)  $\rightarrow$  **fertilise** (verb).
