

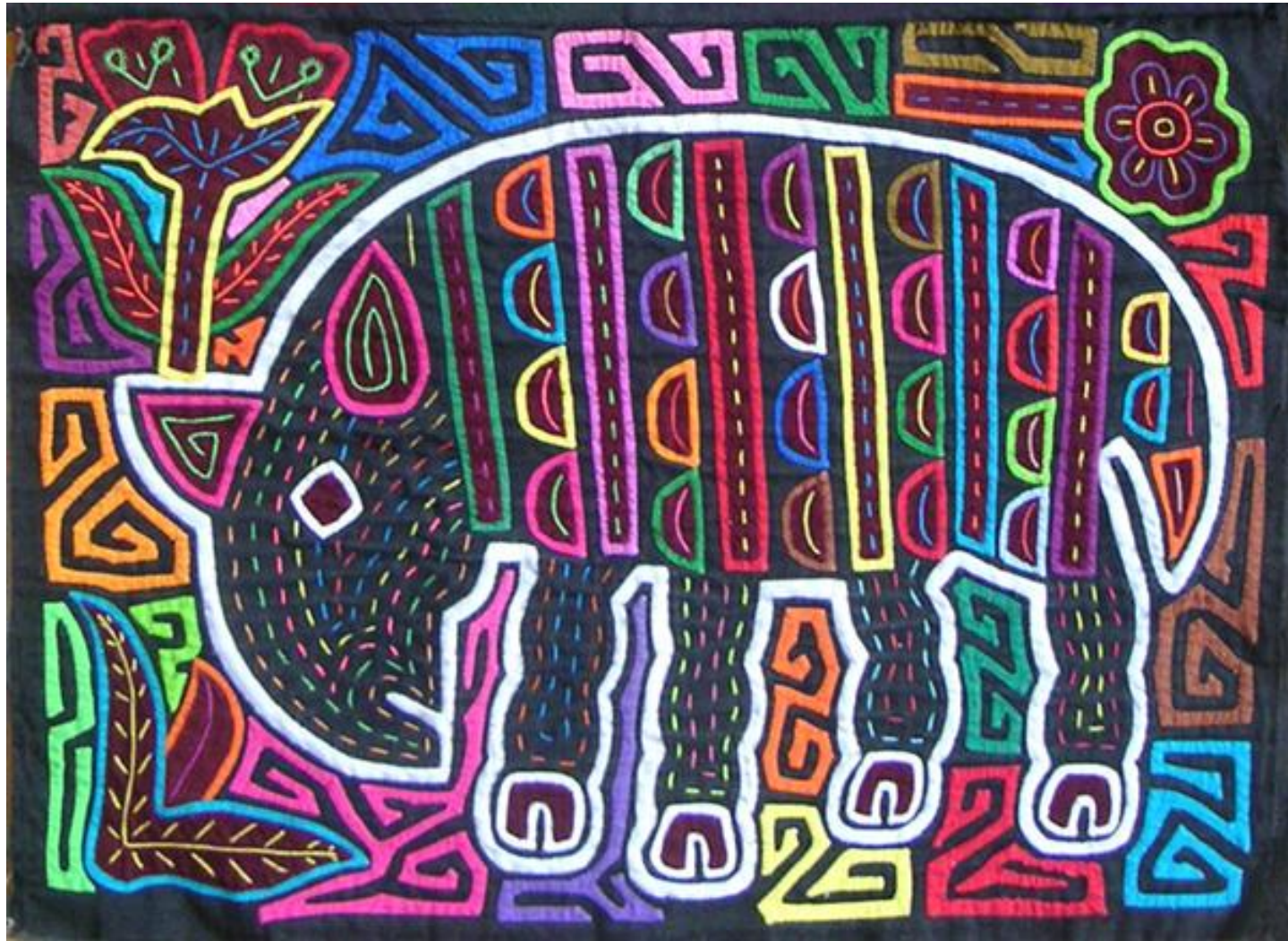

This task is split in to four parts

- 1) Plan idea and animal linked to South America/ geometric pattern you want to use.
- 2) Use oil pastels / crayons to create background.
- 3) Paint oil pastel/crayon with black paint and leave to dry.
- 4) Scratch pattern out of black paint (be careful of the mess!)
- 5) Admire your artwork!
